Our Savior's Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting Minutes December 6, 2011

Note: These minutes need to be approved at the next council meeting January 11, 2012.

The Council of Our Savior's Lutheran Church was called to order by Council President, John Joseph. Present were: Pastor Jensen, Ted Callahan, Peggy Hipsher, Linda Hultman, John Joseph, Rozie Maki, Reen Modeen, Sandy Rau, Bob Ruef, and Doug Thyberg. Also in attendance were: Jonathan Jensen, Fred Baue, Dick Rewalt, Nancy Thyberg, Maureen Johnson, Tess Eisenhauer, Dianna Teppo, Linda Watters, Ken Watters, Karen Wicklund, Julie Peck and Jeanne Joseph.

The meeting began with a prayer by Jonathan Jensen. Linda Hultman will do January's devotion. **Secretary's Report:** The November 9, 2011 minutes were presented. Motion for approval: Reen Modeen/Ted Callahan.

Financial Reports: Bob Ruef presented the Balance Sheet as of November 30, 2011, the Treasurer's Report for January, 2011 through November, 2011 and the Fund Activity Report for the month ending November 2011. Bob noted that on account number 300.660 Money Market Interest Fund, \$130.00 was spilt up with \$15.00 going into the Philby Fund, and the remaining monetary amount going ½ to the roof project and ½ to the scholarship fund. Motion for approval: Rozie Maki/Doug Thyberg. Approved. He also presented Benevolence amounts given from June through November and the December projected amounts, Construction project amounts in 2011,Total income as of 11/30/2011, the Proposed W-2 for the pastor, Money Market Interest Distribution, emails from Bill Philby, and commentaries regarding 2011 financial happenings. Motion to receive this report pending audit: Reen Modeen/Ted Callahan. Approved. Bob also thanked Doug Thyberg for carrying on the finances of our church while he was on vacation.

Bob reported our church is operating with a financial shortfall. He advised the council that when Doug becomes treasurer in January, a minimum of \$2,000.00 should be in the checkbook. To make sure this happens, a transfer from revenue carry-over into the checking account may be needed. Motion to allow the treasurer to transfer an amount sufficient to maintain a check book balance of \$2000 required: Doug Thyberg/Reen Modeen. Approved.

The 2012 offering envelopes will be ready to be given out beginning Sunday, December 11th. There are currently 108 giving units.

Motion: Doug Thyberg/Linda Hultman to keep the parsonage rent at \$600.00 per month for 2012. Approved.

Motion: Bob Rufe/Ted Callahan to authorize the following names on Security State Bank's signature cards for the lock box, CD, Money Market and checkbook: Doug Thyberg, Sandy Rau, John Joseph, and Peggy Hipsher. Approved.

Motion: Reen Modeen/Linda Hultman to have Bob Ruef's and Reen Modeen's accessibility taken off of Church Windows when Doug takes over as treasurer. Approved.

President's Report: John Joseph read a letter from Reen Modeen who wishes to resign from the Council. Her term is up in 2013. An appointment filling her position will be needed. Motion: Linda Hultman/Peggy Hipsher to accept Reen's resignation with regret. Approved.

Pastor's Report: For the month of November, the pastor preached and conducted 3 worship services, participated in a Thanksgiving Eve service, attended 6 church meetings, 2 text studies, 3 Bible study sessions, Sunday parsonage evening Bible studies, six days of Continuing Education, 6 pastoral care sessions,4 hospital/nursing home/home communion visits, the Senior lunch at the Community Center, one Wednesday Bible School and taught 2 confirmation classes.

Six new members are joining our church on December 11th. They are: Ray Levine, Marie Larson, Tom Trautt, Mary Winkler, Julie Thormodsgard(formerly associate member) and Alice Johnson. Motion to accept them into our membership: Ted Callahan/ Reen Modeen. Approved.

The pastor will be posting 'hours of availability' rather than office hours. Her cell and home phone numbers are listed in the bulletin. She will be changing the sign on her door to "Study" rather "Office" to better reflect her position.

The pastor asked council for her final Sunday vacation day on January 1st. The Service of Lessons and Carols will be used in place of her sermon. Approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance: The congregational budget meeting is December 11th. It was noted the Finance Committee does not endorse the budget as it was approved by the Council. It is a deficit budget of \$11,000. However, although the Finance Committee does not like this budget, if it is presented in an honest fashion, explaining its shortfalls, in a clear manner, they are prepared to back the Council. Motion: Sandy Rau/Linda Hultman to present the 2012 budget to the congregation. Approved.

The following committees did not report due to the length of the meeting: Memorial/Honorarium, Outreach/Evangelism, Vibrant Faith, Stewardship, Executive, Worship, and Food Shelf.

Education: The "Advent Fair" was a great success with parents and children making various Christmas crafts and frosting cookies. Another "Fair" is planned in the winter months.

Property: Peggy Hipsher reported the committee has met and suggest roofing materials be purchased now to avoid higher costs in the spring. Motion: to purchase the above materials: Sandy Rau/Rozie Maki. Approved. Mark Santikko and Jim Rau have agreed to chair this project with labor time donated by members and others willing to help.

OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Council and cleaning volunteers: A sign- up sheet will be posted for those members wishing to help each month. The council will each take a month of cleaning.
- b. Goals discussion: Tabled from September meeting.
- c. John Joseph asked Pastor Kristina if she will refuse to meet with the council in closed session to review the evaluation. She responded that she would meet with the council.

NEW BUSINESS: The council filled In a meeting evaluation survey for tonight's meeting.

This meeting is in recess until December 14th at 7:00 when the Church Council and Pastor will discuss and review the recent pastoral evaluations returned from the membership. A summary of evaluations will be given to the congregation.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The annual budget meeting of Our Savior's Lutheran Church was called to order by church council president, John Joseph. The meeting began with scripture taken from 1st Corinthians chapter 12 read by Pastor Kristina. It was determined that we had a quorum with one-third of congregational voting members present.

Approval of Agenda: Motion: Judy Pohjonen/Lynette Kesler. Approved.

Presentation of 2012 Budget: John Joseph presented the 2012 budget and spoke to the congregation explaining the budget preparation by the finance committee and council's struggle with the final proposal. Expenses in the budget total \$113,410, income \$102,000, with a deficit of \$11,410. Questions and comments were taken from the floor and answered by treasurer, Bob Ruef and John. Jeanne Joseph suggested having another budget meeting in six months to see how our membership giving is coming in using the 2012 budget guidelines. Motion: Linda Pepping/Dianna Teppo: Adopt this deficit budget for 6 months and reevaluate and reapprove at the May annual meeting. Carried.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer and was adjourned.

The pastor and council will develop a joint letter for the congregation to read regarding responses from the membership involving her strengths and weaknesses in her ministering to our congregation.


The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Dear friends and members,

In our November newsletter, we asked the congregation to fill out an evaluation of pastoral ministry at Our Savior's. 59 signed evaluations were returned. A lengthy report followed (29 pages) consisting of graphs indicating responses to the 12 'quality indicators' and the numerous responses to open-ended questions. Responses from the council and the overall congregation were quite similar.

Pastoral Care Ministries

In a lengthy, but productive, meeting the pastor and council reviewed the results of the evaluation. Some of the written comments were negative and provided grist for the discussion mill. Overall, the responses to Pastor Kristina's ministry were positive and supportive. We all gained insights into the perspectives of the congregation. One council member said, "I've learned more about the congregation from this activity than I have about the pastor or council," and we all agreed. We will be seeking more input from you during the coming months.

Some of the specific requests of our pastor included the following: be more accessible, increase visitation, be at the church earlier on Sunday mornings and more often in general, be more organized, cut down on repetition in sermons, lack of leadership ability, and number of 'uhs' spoken during worship leadership, lack of involvement/skill with the youth. Members also affirmed many areas of our pastor's ministry. These included visitation, meaningful sermons, accessibility, vision for the congregation, teaching, worship leadership, and musical ability. Conflicting opinions on the same areas of ministry remained constant throughout the responses.

In addition, there were concerns about our council's willingness to work with the pastor, the amount of negativity and grumbling about our pastor in the community, the divisiveness of factions within the church, an 'inward' rather than 'outward' focus on ministry, and the amount of gossip and criticism directed toward our pastor.

Our conversation about the evaluation was healthy, honest, and constructive. We left hopeful. Our pastor is addressing some of your concerns: she is working on the amount of 'uhs' in her speech, is more available (her cell number is now listed on the machine to begin with), is at church earlier on Sunday mornings, and is making an effort to be more organized. We need to support her and work with her as a congregation. As a council, we hear that you want *leadership* as a congregation in our life of ministry together. As a congregation, we hear that you want to *grow*, you want the gossip to stop, and you want to be involved in ministry that models Christian love to our community.

We all have work to do. First, we need to go back to the basics: studying scripture and praying together. Second, we need to get to know each other better. Third, we need to reach out to the community in new ways.

Over the next few months, we will be having more conversations about the life and ministry of Our Savior's because if anything, this evaluation has shown us that we need to hear more from you about *your* vision for the future of our — of Christ's — church here in Iron River. We need your input on joint goals: creating greater unity as a congregation, expanding how we tell the story, and ministering to one another. We also need your prayers. It is tough being a church leader these days, and we need all the help we can get. Finally, we need your renewed commitment to following Jesus and growing in your faith.

We look forward to sharing our vision with you for the future of Our Savior's more fully in the coming months.

CHANGE TO SECRETARY'S HOURS

Beginning in January, there will be some changes to normal 'office hours' for the secretary and the pastor. In addition to being our secretary, Evelyn will be a part-time office assistant at Coldwell Banker's/ East West Reality. Her new hours will be Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 7:30-12:30. The church office will be closed on Tuesdays for the winter, and calls will be transferred to Pastor Kristina who attends text study on Tuesday mornings. This is usually a very quiet day at the church with an average of one call and no visitors. If there is a determined need as the winter progresses, we will ask for volunteers to staff the office on Tuesdays.

Why not simply cut our secretary's hours to 16 hours a week? The simple answer is this: we can't afford to. As our church is getting busier, the workload of our pastor and secretary are *increasing* due to the increased need for communication, coordination, and organization. These changes have been approved by our council who are excited for Evelyn in her new position and glad that she will be able to remain as our secretary with her new job.

CHANGE TO PASTOR'S HOURS

Beginning in January, our pastor will begin 'Hours of Availability' Monday-Thursday 9:00am to 1:00 pm. There will be phone numbers listed in our bulletin where she will expect to receive calls when she is pulled away from the church during these hours and will return calls as soon as she is able to. This is a more realistic reflection of the everchanging demands of a pastor's schedule. Our pastor attends text study on Tuesday mornings, has monthly conference meetings with pastors on Thursdays, and is occasionally pulled away for an emergency visit in the a.m. While not always able to be physically present at the church, our pastor is always accessible. The council is in support of this change and hopes the congregation will find it helpful.




