

### Pastor's Corner

People often ask the meaning behind several Lenten practices. I hope that you will find the following brief articles answering some of the most common questions helpful. Understanding the significance behind our traditions and liturgy makes worship more meaningful. ## What is the meaning of Lent?

Anglo-Saxon: "spring"

As early as the mid-fourth century, Christians have observed a time of preparation before the Easter celebration. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days. The forty days of Lent recall the 40 day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40 day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28). It is a time of simplicity and preparation. Principal themes include:

- Penitence
- Baptismal renewal
- · Preparation for baptism at the Easter Vigil
- Prayer, fasting, and service
- Confession of sin rooted in the promise of God that comes through the cross of Christ

# Why and how do we use ashes on Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is the Wednesday of the seventh week before Easter and the first day of Lent. The day is named for the practice of imposing ashes, a practice which many Lutheran congregations have found to be a very meaningful part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy. Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The early Christians adopted the use of ashes from Jewish practice as an external mark of penitence. Ashes symbolize several aspects of our human existence:

- Ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin, as God said to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).
- Ashes suggest cleansing and renewal. They were used anciently in the absence of soap. On Ash Wednesday
  ashes are a penitential substitute for water as a reminder of our baptism.
- Ashes remind us of the shortness of human life, for it is said as we are buried: "earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust."
- Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

In the Ash Wednesday liturgy, the confession and imposition of ashes marks the beginning of a season of penitence. The Maundy Thursday absolution is the structural response to the Ash Wednesday confession, marking off Lent as a penitential time.

# Why don't we use Alleluias during Lent?

Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice. The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages.

The Council of Our Savior's Lutheran Church was called to order by Council Vice President, Sandy Rau. Present were: Pastor Jensen, Peggy Hipsher, Linda Hultman, Sandy Rau and Doug Thyberg. Excused: Ted Callahan, John Joseph, Rozie Maki, and Bob Ruef. The agenda was approved via email by John Joseph, Bob Ruef, Ted Callahan and Rozie Maki. One council spot needs to be filled until May, 2012.

The meeting began with scripture: Galatians 4:18 read by Linda Hultman. She also read the last part of Dick Rewalt's January 15<sup>th</sup> sermon, "We are Persons with Purpose. What is Your Passion?" Next month Doug Thyberg will have the devotional.

**Secretary's Report:** The December 6<sup>th</sup> and December 14<sup>th</sup> 2011 minutes were presented. Motion for approval: Doug Thyberg/Peggy Hipsher. Approved.

**Financial Reports:** Doug Thyberg presented the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2011, the Treasurer's Report for January 2011 through December 2011, and the Fund Activity Report for the month ending December 2011. It was noted the books are ready and need to be audited for the year, 2011. Sandy Rau will be asking three members from our church to audit them.

Out-going treasurer, Bob Ruef prepared a recap of monies donated by Our Savior's in 2011. Grand Total: \$6883.95

Motion: Doug Thyberg/Linda Hultman to not pay Synod Benevolence for the last three months of 2011. Approved.

The Congregational Plan for 2012 Mission Support at 2% of the current budget will be filled out by the Pastor and Doug. The 2012 budget will be revisited in May.

Motion: Doug Thyberg/Peggy Hipsher to give from Fig Leaf Fund #300.206 the following: \$150.00 for the Winter Youth camp registration at Luther Park in Danbury, WI, \$450.00 for this summer's Vacation Bible School, \$250.00 for the pastor's Discretionary Fund, and \$500.00 to the youth for the New Orleans gathering this summer. Approved.

Pastor's Report: For the month of December, the pastor conducted and preached 8 worship services, attended 6 church meetings, 2 text studies, 3 Bible study sessions, (not including Sunday evenings at the parsonage), 1 Food Shelf breakfast, 3 pastoral care sessions, 6 hospital/nursing home/home communion visits, and 1 community event (Sr. lunch). The pastor is currently preparing a "Mom's Bible Study" which will take place Wednesday afternoons from 2:30-3:30. She is also going to have monthly church services at Willow Manor. She noted that phone calls from the church can be transferred to her cell phone.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Finance: Currently, Doug Thyberg and Dick Rewalt are serving on this committee.

Memorial/Honorarium: None

**Outreach and Evangelism:** A "Winter Madness-a Night of Holy Hilarity" spaghetti supper will be held January 27<sup>th</sup>. Proceeds from this dinner will be given to the General Fund and a new mission church, "Living Water" located in Cameron, WI. January's coffee money for mission will be given to Second Harvest Food Bank, and February's coffee money will be given to "Living Water."

Breakfast also continues to be served during Food Shelf pick up hours each month.

**Vibrant Faith:** Will be renamed **Mutual Ministry** to comply with church Constitution Chapter 13 Congregational Committees: C13.04.

**Education:** The committee met on January 9<sup>th</sup> and discussed Wednesday Bible School updates. Confirmation updates which include our youth joining with confirmation students from Hope Lutheran in March. The committee agreed to ask the council for \$30.00 per student (taken from the Fig Leaf Fund) to help with the registration for those attending from our church. No confirmation classes will be held during Lent. The children will however, have assignments to complete. VBS fund raising possibilities were also discussed.

A Community "Heart to Heart" Fun Day is scheduled for Saturday, February 11, from 2-4 P.M. free of charge at the church.

**Property:** Peggy Hipsher reported: The outdoor church sign has been repaired, bulletin boards were removed from the pastor's office to near the back entrance of the church, most of the radiator covers were fixed up, the light at the back door has been fixed but is in poor shape, rope lights from the cross on the north side of the building were removed they too were in poor shape. Some window blind parts in the fellowship hall need replacing. Also, the front entry lights are not working and need replacement. **Worship:** Met on January 9<sup>th</sup>. Hymns were chosen through February 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Food Shelf:** Scheduled for distribution on January 21<sup>st</sup>. Produce will be distributed on January 24<sup>th</sup>. This month it is Our Savior's turn to help.

Motion to accept the committee reports: Peggy Hipsher/Doug Thyberg. Approved.

#### **Rural Care and Share Food Shelf**

Facts Sheet 12/18/2011

The Rural Care and Share Food Shelf serves an average of 120 families per month in Douglas and Bayfield Counties.

The Food Shelf is open the 3rd Saturday of every month at two locations - Iron River and Poplar, Wi.

Twelve area churches have volunteers that manage the food shelves - six churches in the Iron River area, and six churches in the Poplar area. RCSFS, board consists of 22 members and meets every other month to conduct business.

Food orders are placed each month at the Northern Lakes Food Bank in Duluth, and are delivered by their truck. TEFAP (Emergency Food Assistance Program) food is picked up each month at Northwest Community Services in Superior.

Sources of income to purchase food:

FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Fund Raisers Community Donations

FEMA funding for 2011 was \$2200 to Douglas County, and \$1500 to Bayfield County. We have been informed that Douglas County funds have been cut by 90% to food shelves and emergency shelters. We are not sure what the final figures are going to be for our local food shelf.
