## Pastor's Corner

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

*For everything there is a season,  
and a time for every matter under heaven:  
a time to be born, and a time to die;  
a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;  
a time to kill, and a time to heal;  
a time to break down, and a time to build up;  
a time to weep, and a time to laugh;  
a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

a time to tear, and a time to sew;

All of life is a sacred time. As the author of Ecclesiastes writes, *for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven*. This includes disappointment, lost dreams, confusion, frustration, despair, doubt, death – or any time in which we feel somehow different and detached from the world. During these times, it is easy to look out at everyone and wonder, “Is everyone celebrating life but me?”

God doesn't forsake us in these times, though many questions often point to that conclusion. “*Why is this happening to me? To those I love? Where is God when I need God the most? Why doesn't God hear my prayers? Why is God silent?*”

These questions are not easily answered. Sometimes God does seem silent, and sometimes there is no explanation of why that will satisfy.

We do have the confidence that in all times of life, there is a God who suffers with us: a God who gave his son to die on the cross so that death and meaninglessness might be defeated.

God doesn't answer our questions with an explanation, but with an empty cross, and empty tomb, and an eternal promise.

*Let us pray:*

*Gracious God, thank you for giving us your Word and your promise. When it is difficult to hope, surround us with a community of faith who can hope for us. When time seems to flow around us in a different way, help us to see your promise for our lives one day at a time. Amen.*

Congregational Council Meeting Minutes: June 12, 2012**

**Note:** These minutes need to be approved at the next council meeting, July 10, 2012.

Council meeting of Our Savior's Lutheran Church was called to order by Council President, John Joseph. Present were: Pastor Jensen, Howard Lehman, Sandy Rau, Bob Ruef, Cindy Knapp, Doug Thyberg, Rozie Maki, Ken Tanula.

The meeting began with an opening devotion of 1 Timothy Chapter 4 read aloud. Pastor led the devotion with a task of finding gifts and talents of other council members. Next month, Cindy will lead devotions from 1 Timothy, Chapter 5.

The meeting proceeded with an **election of officers**.

**Sandy Rau** offered to carry out the position of **Vice President**. Motion from Cindy Knapp, second by John Joseph, motion carried.

**Doug Thyberg** agreed to carry out the position of **Treasurer/Financial Secretary**. A motion from John Joseph, second by Cindy Knapp, motion carried.

**Peggy Hipsher** agreed to carry out the position of **Secretary**. Motion by, Cindy Knapp, second by Howard Lehman, motion carried.

Cindy Knapp and Rozie Maki nominated Bob Ruef for the office of president, after some discussion, Bob declined. Bob Ruef nominated Howard Lehman for the office of president. After further discussion, Howard declined. Sandy nominated **Rozie Maki** for the office of **President**. Motion by Bob, second by Howard, motion carried.

**The Secretary's report** was handed out and reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes from the May 2012 Council meeting as presented by Sandy Rau, second by John Joseph. Motion carried.

**The financial report** was handed out and reviewed. Doug Thyberg noted that the fund account for VBS was not listed any longer as they now have their own checking account. Sandy asked if it was still subject to audit. Doug said yes. The fund account 300.619 Roof Project has 4945.08 left in the account. There was some discussion about moving that money to an account such as 300.229 Church Property Maintenance Fund. Council members felt that the congregation needed to be aware of the transfer. Doug will put information into the newsletter about moving the remaining funds. It will go on the August agenda for a vote.

Doug reported that he will give a more in depth report on the first six months of operations during the July meeting. There were more questions about certain accounts and their history by council members. Doug agreed to give a brief history on how the finances are set up and Fund balances at the next meeting.

Motion to approve the Finance report pending audit by John Joseph, second by Ken Tanula. Motion carried.

**President's report:** John reported that the Congregational meeting passed the budget as it stood for the remaining six months of the year. Motion to accept the President's report by Howard, second by Sandy. Motion carried.

**Pastor's report:** Pastor gave a verbal report. She thanked all who were able to lead worship during her time on vacation. The synod assembly has their report up on the web site. There is a link on our website to it. Pastor reported that the synod has suggested churches remove the "gun" signs from the buildings until further legislation has passed. Ken Tanula agreed to remove these signs tomorrow.

Pastor continued by thanking Cindy for helping teach confirmation this year and by thanking Sandy for all the work on the landscaping. Pastor had led a commissioning service at Amnicon State Park and was very pleased with the accommodations there. She would like to use the space for future retreats.

**Outreach and Evangelism:** The "noisy" cans collected \$58.00 for World Hunger. The committee will advertise for the Polka Service at Moon Lake Park for August 26, 2012. We are continuing to serve breakfast on Food Shelf Saturdays. The committee will be reviewing the surveys on Saturday.

**Vibrant Faith Team:** Will be meeting every three months.

**Education Committee:** They met last week. They have a notice in the bulletin and newsletter for a host family for 3 counselors, cleaned rooms in the back, reviewed the craft list for VBS in July, raised \$111.00 toward VBS expenses on ice cream sundaes.

**Mutual Ministry:** This committee is to be formed by Pastor and Council President. They will continue to work on this.

**Property Committee:** Thanks to individuals who took it upon themselves to carry out some cleaning of our church inside and out. WELCA paid to have the vacuum cleaner repaired.

**Stewardship Committee:** Rozie is reviewing some new materials.

**Executive Committee:** No report/no meeting.

**Worship Committee:** Special music and services have been coordinated into July.

**Food Shelf Committee:** No report.

## ***Focus on 1 Timothy***

The council read and discussed chapter four of 1 Timothy at the beginning of the council meeting. We are reading through the book of 1 Timothy as our devotions for the next few months to learn from scripture what church leadership should look like.

The chapter opens with a warning to be on the lookout for false ascetics who claim moral purity but who, in fact, wrongly denounce the good things that God has given us including marriage and foods which God created to be enjoyed. " v.4 *For everything God created is good, and nothing is to be rejected, provided it is received with thanksgiving; for it is sanctified by God's word and by prayer.* " The letter continues with a reminder to stay away from 'old wives tales' and 'profane myths'. As an alternative, Paul instructs to "train yourself in godliness," as godliness holds promise for both the present life and the life to come". He uses the analogy of physical training to point out the merit of continually focusing on God's word and prayer.

Our main focus of the discussion stemmed from verse 14, "*Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you through prophecy with the laying on of hands by the council of elders. Put these things into practice, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress.*" Members thought about what gifts they felt God had given them for ministry and how they would to use one or two of those gifts in the coming year. Answers ranged from "Speaking More" to "Doing hands-on-projects" and "Nursing" to "music". Council members then took turns sharing with one another the gifts they saw in one another: leadership, creativity, determination, hospitality, common sense, music, practicality, finance, etc. It became clear that as we work together, God has blessed this council with an abundance of good gifts for church leadership. This was a good way to start our time together as a new council. Please pray for us as we continue to carry out the work of the church as your partners in Christ.

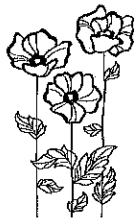

## Landscaping Begins

A lot of planning and work has gone into stage one of the landscaping at Our Saviors Lutheran Church. We asked Peterson Landscaping for a simple, low maintenance design. To save cost, Jim Rau, Mark Santikko, Bob and Bertie Reuf, Jim Olson and myself removed 8 inches of soil from the planting beds.

Jim Rau hauled in the rock used for the bench pad. This was generously donated by Mike Germano.

Bob Ruef helped me plant the hosta bed, on the north end of the church, and we placed, leveled and filled the 2 heavy rock planters on the east side of the church. Bob, Bertie and I weeded the rock drip area. This really cleaned up the outside look of the church.

Saturday, June 2 was the exciting planting day. The landscapers were here at 9am to install black plastic edging, fill the planting area with top soil, landscape fabric and cedar bark mulch. Jeanie, their Master Gardener, placed the plants according to the plan and planted each one in its own hole. She finished at 5:30pm.

I was able to get some areas planted with grass seed. The landscapers helped me by putting down landscape fabric and mulch by the back door and installing a black plastic edging around the hosta bed.

I got the planters planted on Monday and Bertie and I continue to water the landscape plants and grass seed, daily.

Janelle Armbruster has donated a bench, in memory of her son, Ronnie. I hope all of you get a chance to sit on the bench as you admire the plants.

Inspired from Joshua 4:1-9, after parting the Red Sea, God commanded the Isrealites to make a pile of 12 stones as a reminder of Gods miracle and to remind them of his work in their lives. I believe we need a similar reminder for ourselves. Jeanette Vetter will make this reminder of stones in our garden.

Ken Tanula has tackled the stump in the front lawn. He is chopping at it by hand and has made amazing progress. I'm sure he would like any volunteers to help him. Then new grass seed can be planted there as well.

Thank you for designated donations to the landscape Project as part of the Memorial Fund. Many of you have chosen to remember your loved ones in this way. As this fund continues to grow we will be able to expand the planted areas around Our Saviors.

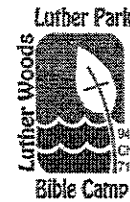

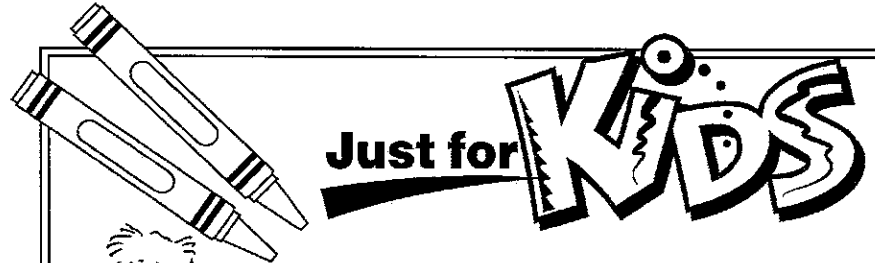

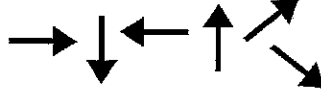
