Shall we gather at the river, Where bright angel feet have trod, With its crystal tide forever Flowing by the throne of God?

> Yes, we'll gather at the river, the beautiful, the beautiful river; gather with the saints at the river that flows by the throne of God.

During the deep freeze of this winter, I've found myself humming more of the dear old hymns than usual. Shall We Gather at the River, the Old Rugged Cross, In the Garden, I Love to Tell the Story....

There is something about those faithful, familiar words that inspires the spirit and calms a troubled mind. God has given us troubles, yes, but he has also given us the gift of song to see us through those trials. He has given us the gift of good folk to sing with, and lively melodies that take root in our heart and stir our souls to sing in the midst of – and even in spite of – the difficulties that we face.

There is a lyrical quality to those old beloved hymns that goes beyond the beautiful melodies and carefully crafted texts. A hymn that endures the text of time surely has both. Where the two meet is where the true miracle occurs. When the vivid imagery of the text is infused with the feeling of joy, calm, pardon or longing; truly we have an experience of the divine.

Take, for example, the hymn whose text is listed in part above. Take a moment to hear the sound of rushing water. See the lush green ferns. Feel the crowd of saints gathering around you as you stand in awe together at the wonder of being in the presence of angels at the base of God's very throne.

As one reads the stories behind these hymns, one is struck by how many were born from pure experiences of the divine's intervention within pain and grief. Amazing Grace was born out of a former slave captain's remorse and subsequent experience of grace. The words to "Rock of Ages" came as a gift to a preacher who was caught in a terrible storm and took shelter in a crevice within a gorge. "Shall We Gather at the River" was written by a Baptist Pastor who experienced a burst of immense joy and saw a vision of the foot of God's throne as he stood by a flowing river. As he began to ponder why there were so many hymns that referenced the river of death but not the referenced the river of life, the words for "Shall We Gather" began to take their shape.

We read of visions and dreams in the Bible and sometimes believe that those were things only of ages past. But the experience of our hymn writers tell us that visions and dreams are still alive and well. God continues to give us strength for the journey in a changing world. He brings us experiences of life, joy and hope so that the pain of death will never overpower us. And so we sing. Just as we live it, we sing God's vision of life that is everlasting, pure, and real. So even though it is below zero, your keys are frozen in their locks, and the snow plow has hemmed you in — sing on. We hear the gushing sound of running water at the river of life as we hum those familiar hymns and wait for warmer weather. Easter is coming. Sing on.

Old Business:


