Bridge Builders Update

The Bridge Builder Focus Group sessions have been very successfully completed. The sessions had a total attendance of 97 people. Some folks attended more than one session but still it was a very good turnout for each of the sessions. Thanks to everyone who came and a second thanks for your comments. There were 15 goals that were presented and we received 286 comments on the 15 goals. Each of the 286 comments have been aligned with their respective goal and the Bridge Builder Subcommittees are currently reviewing each. The comments will be applied to the current draft of the Bridge Builder Plan with an eye toward those that would modify or add to the strategies to achieve the Goals. The 15 Bridge Building Goals that were presented in the Focus Group sessions are as follows:

- **#1 Communications Goal:** OSLC will provide clear and concise communication in accessible formats to its members
- **#2 Communications Goal:** The Welfare of OSLC will be enhanced when we first Listen to God, then Listen to one another with "Love being the Basis of Every Interaction".
- **#3 Communications Goal:** Create an environment in which our OSLC members take ownership of our mission and the projects/activities of our church.
- #4 Finance/Stewardship/Budget Goal: Adopt an ongoing Stewardship program to include updated, time talent monetary giving process.
- #5 Finance/Stewardship/Budget Goal: Adopt an annual budget based on need, which will allow us to maintain operating expenses and meet Synod guidelines for Pastoral Salary
- #6 Planning Goal: Progressive Youth Ministry "We are all Teachers".
- #7 Planning Goal: Improve Bible Study Opportunities.
- #8 Planning Goal: Worship Improvements.
- #9 Planning Goal: Create an Environment of Inclusiveness.
- #10 Planning Goal: Property Improvement.
- #11 Staff Guidance Goal: Create a detailed Description of Duties (Job Description) for all paid OSLC staff.
- #12 Staff Guidance Goal: Establish an annual performance evaluation process for all paid OSLC staff.
- #13 Staff Guidance Goal: Create a simple record keeping form capable of recording staff and church/council contacts, mileage and all categories of time off.
- **#14 Staff Guidance Goal:** Establish a Sunday morning pattern for length of Church activities that comfortably allows for Worship, Fellowship and Religious Scholarship.
- #15 Staff Guidance Goal: Create an occupancy agreement for the OSLC Parsonage.

The Bridge Builder Action Plan will be finalized shortly and provided to the OSLC Council. The plan will offer many opportunities to everyone in the Congregation to respond to the two greatest commandments. <u>First:</u> Love God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. <u>Second:</u> Love your neighbor as yourself.

The Bridge Builder Action Plan will be a living document. Revisits and updates will be made on a periodic basis. It is the intent of the Action Planning Team to come back together after about six months to gauge the success of our progress with each of the 15 Goals and add, modify or delete strategies as needed.
