Since the beginning of November interim ministry (I.M.) has been underway. Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes – December 7, 2015

Meeting was called to order by President Howard Lehman at 5:00 pm. Cindy led us in opening devotions. Secretary's report was reviewed. Motion by Peg and seconded by Nan to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report was presented by Peg. We are again in the black this month. Staying caught up with bills. We are collecting next year's pledges but we only have 43 returned out of the 95 sent out. We can make guesses of income from last year's giving, but it would be a huge help to the finance people if members would turn them in. Please, pray about your pledge, God will direct you.

We have to get a Health Insurance Policy for Pastor John through Portico. After reviewing, we chose the Silver plan at a cost of \$664 per month. This policy will be in effect thru 2016 and used by any interim or called pastor. Pastor John agreed with the selection. A motion was made by Cindy and seconded by Lynette to approve this policy. Motion carried.

A brief discussion followed about insurance. Funding has been a problem in the past. A decision was made to move \$5,400 from the general fund into an Insurance Contingency Fund to be used to pay any insurance bills as they come due. Lynette made a motion to earmark this fund and it was seconded by Cindy. Motion passed. Cindy made a motion to accept the financial report, seconded by Lynette. It will be filed for audit.

Peg has contacted Ron Michaelis to plow our parking lot again this year. The cost will be \$72/hr or \$1.25/minute. (We paid a total of \$445 last year for plowing.) Motion made by Cindy and seconded by Nan to approve this expense. Motion carried.

President's report

- Letter of Agreement for Interim Pastoral Ministry has been completed and sent to the synod. We are waiting for the Bishop's signature.
- Informational meeting was held on November 29 where Howie, Pastor and Doug Thyberg gave a report on the letter of agreement for Interim Pastoral Ministry. Howie talked about the congregations and pastors responsibilities during the interim time. Pastor spoke about his pastoral duties and expectations, and Doug filled us in on the cost for the interim program.
- We will hold more informational meetings. Possible topics will include our monthly-just to keep the doors open and the lights on-expenses as well as more detailed discussions as to what we can afford for a permanent pastor.

filling out a questionnaire. Pastor will train this committee to lead small groups thru this process one Sunday
per month during January, February and March. Committee will be chosen by council and pastor. Those
members who have left for the winter will be sent the questions so their answers can be compiled with the
members in Iron River.

Due to the lateness of the evening and no pressing committee/old/new business, a motion was made by Lynette and seconded by Cindy to table any further business until next month. Motion carried.

Mission of the Month



Salem Baptist Church

In the early 1880's, Swedish missionaries conducted a preaching mission in northern Wisconsin. On July 8, 1883, a Swedish Baptist Church was organized in Ashland.

From 1893-1908 Salem fostered 7 sister churches. From 1945-1953, the Sunday Schools branched out into several rural areas using the one-room school houses to meet in. In 1953, a bus/auto ministry began to bring adults & children from these outlying areas to Salem. The present property was purchased and in 1982, Salem moved into their new facility. Reflecting on this time, one member shared that "one of the greatest things to happen during the building was the oneness of spirit---getting to know each other, working together and sensing God's presence and leading."


